Shubha Ghosh was a professor and director of the intellectual property program at the University at Buffalo Law School, SUNY, from 2000–2006. His published work has appeared or will appear in the *Harvard Journal of Law and Technology*, *Illinois Law Review*, *San Diego Law Review*, *Tulane Law Review*, *Berkeley Journal of Law and Technology*, *Florida Law Review*, and as chapters in books published by Cambridge University Press, MIT Press, and Stanford University Press. He was a clerk on the US Court of Appeals for the Ninth Circuit and an associate with Baker & McKenzie in its San Francisco/Palo Alto office. He is the co-author of two casebooks, *Intellectual Property in Business Organizations* (Lexis-Nexis 2006) and *Intellectual Property: Private Rights, the Public Interest, and the Regulation of Creative Activity* (Thomson-West 2007). His current work focuses on intellectual property and the regulatory state in a world regime of free and open trade. He recently wrote an *amicus* brief in favor of the petitioner in the *Quanta v. LG Electronics* case, which is before the US Supreme Court this term. The case, which deals with the first-sale doctrine in patent law, will be part of the subject of his talk.

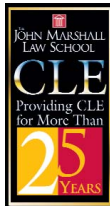
