Clarisa Long is the Max  
Mendel Shaye Professor of

Intellectual Property Law at Columbia. Her areas of expertise include intellectual property law and policy, the political economy of intellectual property, and contract law, particularly public contract law. Prior to joining the Columbia Law School faculty, Professor Long was a member of the University of Virginia School of Law faculty for six years and the Class of 1966 Research Professor. Professor Long received her JD from Stanford Law School, clerked for Judge Alvin A. Schall of the US Court of Appeals for the Federal Circuit, was a lecturer at Harvard University, and worked as an attorney in private practice at Wiley, Rein & Fielding.

Before going to law school, she was a molecular biologist with the University of Auckland Medical School in Auckland, New Zealand, and conducted molecular biology research at the National Institutes of Health in Bethesda, Maryland.

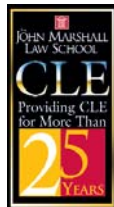
