Shubha Ghosh was a professor and director of the intellectual property program at the University at Buffalo Law School, SUNY, from 2000–2006. He served as professor of law at Southern Methodist University, Dedman School of Law in Dallas, Texas, from 2006–2008. His published work has appeared or will appear in the *Harvard Journal of Law and Technology*, *Illinois Law Review*, *San Diego Law Review*, *Tulane Law Review*, *Berkeley Journal of Law and Technology*, *Florida Law Review*, and as chapters in books published by Cambridge University Press, MIT Press, and Stanford University Press.

Professor Ghosh was a clerk on the US Court of Appeals for the Ninth Circuit and an associate with Baker & McKenzie in its San Francisco/Palo Alto office. He is the co-author of two casebooks, *Intellectual Property in Business Organizations* (LexisNexis 2006) and *Intellectual Property: Private Rights, the Public Interest, and the Regulation of Creative Activity* (Thomson-West 2007).

His current work focuses on intellectual property and the regulatory state in a world regime of free and open trade. He recently wrote an *amicus* brief in favor of the petitioner in the *Quanta v. LG Electronics* case before the US Supreme Court.

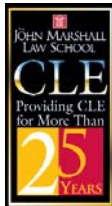
