Attendance

The Board of Law Examiners in each state requires a certificate of attendance from the law schools attended by the applicant in order to take the bar examination. To execute this certificate faithfully, the school must insist on regular attendance. Therefore, students are required to attend all classes scheduled. A student absent for more than 25% of the total number of class meetings will not be allowed to write the examination and will receive a grade of WF (withdraw/fail) for the course, unless permission has been granted by the Registrar. The number of absences permitted may be reduced by the professor on notice to the class.

The John Marshall Law School recognizes the diversity of religious practices of its students, faculty, and staff. Therefore, in addition to the 25% allowed, with prior notification to professors, students are excused for religious observance from two class sessions in each course enrolled in every semester.
