Externship Compensation Policy

The Law School will not grant credit to a student in an externship for which the student receives compensation beyond reasonable out-of-pocket expenses related to the externship. The Vice Dean for Academic Affairs will determine whether the compensation offered is reasonable for out-of-pocket expenses by considering the geographic location of the externship and the cost-of-living in that location, travel expenses to and from the location of the externship, travel-expense reimbursement rates allowed by the law school, the nature of the relationship between the student and externship provider, the type of assignments likely to be given to the student, and other factors that the Vice Dean for Academic Affairs considers relevant.

Faculty policy adopted May 4, 2017; effective immediately.
